Malvern College Book Week

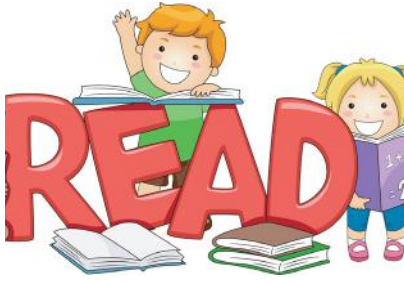

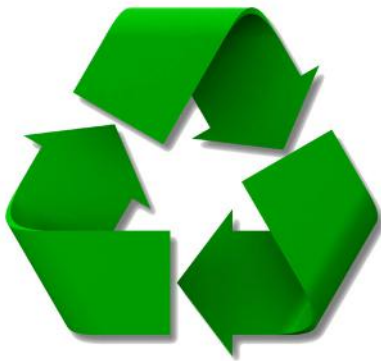

Secondary School News from Wayne Maher – Head of Secondary

Over the last few weeks there has been a focus in the older year groups on looking ahead to future study. It was wonderful to see so many of the Year 9 Parents at an information session on Wednesday about the pathways we intend to offer to graduation from MCE. Our aim is to not only offer a curriculum that builds on our local context of Ministry curriculum and Egyptian university requirements but, just as importantly, begin to reflect the elements that would be expected and required for graduation from Malvern College UK.

It is for this reason that we are planning for pathways that allows students to graduate at either Year 12 or Year 13 depending on a wide range of factors from the age of the student to the university they aspire to attend. We will offer further information sessions to our wider parent community on the 12 and 13 year pathways in the coming months.

Our Year 8 students have been submitting their choices for the (I)GCSE options and meeting with our University Counsellor, Mrs. Lauren Hills, to get further advice on the pathways through to graduation and future employment. This is one of the first opportunities these students will have had in their education to really make choices about what areas of curriculum they will study. This is a huge demand to place on young students but is a necessary part of developing confident and independent young adults who can realise their university and career goals in the future.



Year 7 – History, Mr. Gillespie-Payne

In recent weeks the Year 7 students have been studying the topic of the Norman invasion of England in 1066. As a sub-topic they examined how the Normans controlled England through the use of a system of castles. Students were tasked with constructing a castle that showed the 6 key features of Norman fortifications. They were given the freedom to use any material and although a range of cardboard and clay models were shown it was a delight for all involved to have a number of edible castles submitted (I wonder if the remains of these cake castles accurately reflect Norman construction!?).
