
Early Years News from Sally Dibb-Holland - Head of Early Years

Dear Parents,



In Pre-Nursery this week the children have been making robots using squares, exploring the shape of a square and understanding that a square has four equal sides. The children have also been learning about number four and undertaking a variety of practical activities to recognise number four, what is looks like, and how many objects together make four. Counting from one, two, three to four. The children have been revising their learning of circle, triangle and square as well as the numbers one, two and three. They continue to make the most of the cooler weather enjoying the climbing frames, ride-on toys and the outdoor garden.

In Nursery this week the children have been following their interests in animals and their homes with a focus on volcanoes. They have been using spoons to scoop powder and bottles and cups to pour liquid – discussing the amount of liquid when filling their model volcano with different ingredients. Whilst exploring volcanoes they were noticing the amounts of 'lava', liquid, powder and comparing when there was more or less liquid. An extension activity included the children taking turns to mix the powder and liquid and create the eruptions independently.



Following children's interests in habitats – woodlands and forests of "The Gruffalo." Through reading "The Gruffalo" story and identifying the animals and their homes in the story. The children have completed puzzles of The Gruffalo picture book. An extension activity was to read The Whale and Snail story to see the volcano in the story. Look at pictures of volcanos and discussing what they could see and what they know about volcanoes. During class story time sharing "The Gruffalo" reading

the book with the story sack and puppets. Encouraging all the children to use descriptive wow words to describe animals and The Gruffalo. Enabling all children to use props to help retell the story. RWI sounds, phoneme 'v' - words beginning with 'v' volcano, vet, van. Letter formation – v for volcano.



In Reception this week, the children have been finding out facts about spiders, they have looked at non-fiction sources and considered if the information is true or false. They have all written down their own fact files about spiders and designed spider webs with chalk to create wonderful individual art work. The children have revisited life cycles from last week – spider life cycles. We have shared and enjoyed the story of The very busy spider.

In mathematics this week the children build 2 digit numbers focusing on tens shared board games counting on using

worked on and reinforced number recognition of numbers beyond 10. The children have taken part in counting games above 10. Literacy activities have included writing their news from the weekend along with specific phonic revision and sentence writing activities in class.



IGCSE Exam Timetable

The IGCSE exams are coming closer and closer. We will shortly be sending out the Exam Timetable which will provide all the times and dates etc. I will write more after the holiday but there will be opportunities for students to attend revision sessions in college time and teachers will be running some sessions on Fridays and Saturdays (full details will be provided shortly). With regard revision all students should by now have formalized their revision sessions at

home, be completing past papers and generating notes to aid in reviewing their previous learning. Please do remind them of the importance of revision!



Study Leave

Study Leave during exams is always a contentious issue but we do believe that unstructured time away from the classroom is not conducive to higher grades and there is now more and more evidence which supports this. For this reason there will be no study leave but study time provided in school with teachers.

We want to keep them engaged and focused right up to their exam - and it means we can target their learning. We are also very aware of the need to help them cope with the pressure - if you see a child looking panicked, you can have a reassuring conversation and help them get things into perspective.

There has also been a shift in the type of exam questions over recent years. In the past, there was a lot of rote learning required, but questions today test a pupil's use of knowledge. They're not just regurgitating facts, they're putting their learning into practice and engaging with issues - and to answer those sorts of questions, it's easier to revise by talking things through than by sitting in your bedroom at home."

Also, the timing of exams is changing every year the first exam creeps earlier, and you'd end up with study leave going on for weeks and weeks.



I do recognise there are pros and cons on both sides of the argument - some students can manage to work well at home - but I think there's a lot of support a school can give young people in the build-up to their exams. Learning to organise their work, learning how to sort their work out, doesn't come naturally to a lot of students - and if they're in school, we can help with that. And of course, the other thing is that at home there are so many temptations to do other things, whereas at school it can be easier to focus!

On the 17th of March 2018 31 incredibly excited students and 4 over excited staff met at 6 am to start what would be another amazing ski trip. With all students on time and with suitcases bigger than themselves, we set off for a week in the Swiss alps and our second home of Les Efles La Tzoumaz.

After a painless flight and easy transfer through Geneva airport, we made our way up to the resort which is at 1,500m. Snow covered the roads as we climbed the twisty mountain road until we arrived and were greeted by many of the same staff as last year. Ski fitting always happens on arrival day and it was great that so many of our students knew exactly what sizes boots and skis they needed having been to Ski Egypt previously.

The snow conditions in La Tzoumaz were incredible. We were lucky enough to be skiing in the best conditions they have had for almost 10 years. With perfectly groomed pistes, fresh snow most nights, the MCE ski trip could not have anything but an amazing week.
