Languages Day Treasure Hunt – Years 3 and 4



On Languages Day in January, the pupils from Years 3 and 4 took part in a very enjoyable Treasure Hunt in their House teams. They competed to find and solve clues which required them to use their knowledge of French. The pupils worked really well together and had lots of fun.

Malvern Marathon

Mrs Phillips organised this very popular project, which benefitted two different charities, African Hope Learning Centre for refugees in Egypt and NSPCC which aims to protect children at risk in the UK. Our pupils were sponsored to run laps of the school in a fun and relaxed "marathon". Just over 26,000 EGP was raised.





Foster Dress Up Day



In February, pupils enjoyed the third dress-up day of the year, to raise the profile of the House Charity ESMA and to raise funds for them. ESMA takes care of animals in need, providing food, shelter and medical treatment. The theme was "Star Wars, Marvel and Superheroes." A variety of fabulous costumes were on display.

Across the school, pupils were involved in implementing or participating in fund-raising activities. It is great to see how they are developing a better understanding of the importance and value of helping others through volunteering time and effort. Nearly 17,000 EGP was raised - thank you to all staff, pupils and parents who supported the event.

Primary visits to Elgar's Charity - Branches of the Vine



We were able to organise for all three of the Year 6 classes to visit our Elgar Charity. Our pupils prepared and participated in art/craft activities with the children at "Branches of the Vine." These children all have significant special educational needs. Our Year 6 teachers all returned from the trip with extremely positive comments about how our pupils had handled the visits with great sensitivity.

Visits to Foster's Charity - ESMA





Pupils from both Primary and Secondary school have had two visits this term to the Foster House charity, ESMA (Egyptian Society for Mercy to Animals) dog shelter. The pupils donated a substantial amount of money, that has been raised over the past year through numerous Foster events. The money donated will be used to supply the dogs with food, medical supplies and improvements to their lives. It was a spectacular two days as we were able to play with the dogs as well as wash them. We greatly enjoyed our time in the shelter as not only were all the dogs excited to meet all of us, but the workers responsible for the care of these dogs were extremely welcoming and took us in with open arms. The day was a great success and 84,200 EGP was the total raised. This was an amazing example of our MCE community and family spirit.



Secondary Debate Competition

This term saw our first ever inter-house Debate Competition. Every Wednesday or Thursday, two Houses would go head to head to debate an exciting motion. We had motions such as "This House believes that historically men and women have contributed equally to society" and "This House believes that the beauty industry causes more harm than good". Each House had three speakers, two of which would speak before opening up the floor to the audience to raise questions and make comments. We would then listen to the final speaker from each House before the judges announced the winning House and the Best Public Speaker.
