Early Years News from Sally Dibb-Holland – Head of Early Years



The Reception and Year 1 children enjoyed a wonderful trip to the Sitara Theatre at Porto Cairo Mall on Sunday morning to see the show, **Little Red Riding Hood**. The Year 1 children had the opportunity to join in and do some acting and demonstrated outstanding self-confidence and the ability to perform in front of an audience. All the children also took part in a workshop which involved making rockets from ultra-violet materials. The smaller workshop theatre was set up with special lights which show up the bright colours when shown under ultra-violet

lighting. During this workshop each child was able, within a small group, to dance on the stage to music whilst moving to the music and moving their rockets around, all that the children in the audience could see were the rockets whirling and twirling around the dark space.





It was an exciting spectacle and so much fun for each child to watch their friends and to take part themselves. This ultra-violet light was also used for the short production of **The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark**, an excellent production acted completely in the dark by the Sitara actors. The team at Sitara provided a wonderful experience for our children yesterday. To be part of a live performance is exceptionally special. All that they offer really meets the needs of the Reception and Year 1 aged children who were so enriched by the whole day.

The Pre-Nursery children have started their mini topic on senses and the teaching team have devised some exceptionally interesting and inspiring approaches to enable your children to learn and explore all about their senses. The Nursery children continue to learn about transport, watch out for some underwater transport taking shape along with the space rockets!

Primary School News from Johnnie Kittermaster – Head of Primary School

Dear Parents,



As of this week there are no plastic cups for water in the school. Please can ensure that your child comes to school with a named water bottle.



On Tuesday in Celebration Assembly we were joined by Mr Paul Bates, the Director of Academic IT, who talked to the students about Internet Safety Day. He talked about appropriate use of social media and keeping yourself safe on the internet as you do not know who you are talking to and to think carefully about photos that you are posting on social media as they will always be somewhere on the world-wide web!

As a staff, we were astounded by the numbers of students who use social media on a regular basis and bearing in mind that Facebook, Snapchat and Instagram have an age restriction of 13 years old we were surprised that a third to half of the students in the Primary School admitted to using these social media

platforms. Added to this we were shocked to see that so many children play Xbox games like Call of Duty and Grand Theft Auto. In these games, the content and language used is wholly inappropriate for children in the Primary School as they have an 18 certificate. There are children in Year 3 playing these games! Please look at what your children are doing on their computers, check the privacy settings and make sure that the games that they are playing are age appropriate.







In Year 3 we have been learning all about light and shadows. We recently learned that there is a type of light that comes from the sun, called UV light, that can be harmful to us. We cannot see UV light so we carried out an experiment to see its effects. The different shapes that we cut out are protecting the paper underneath it from the UV rays. As you can see, the paper around the shapes has changed in colour and the paper under the shapes has not! This is because only part of the paper was protected from UV rays. We also learned that the sun has some good qualities (it provides light and heat and helps plants to grow) but also has some bad qualities (it can cause sunburn, wrinkles and skin cancer!)

We designed our own hats and sunglasses to think about what we need to



protect ourselves from these UV rays. If you are playing in the sun, always wear sun cream and a hat! Speak to Year 3 for some more ideas!

We have a growing number of Year 1 students wishing to take instrumental lessons, this is by personal arrangement only. We can only offer lessons to Year 1 students if a parent is available to escort them to and from each lesson, remembering that lessons will not be at the same time each week

Please could I also stress the importance of practice between lessons. To make progress your child needs to practise daily on their instrument. Just 10 to 15 minutes a day, five days a week, for a beginner is enough to see a real difference. The more your child practises, the better they will become and the more they will enjoy playing their instrument. It is therefore vital your child has an instrument too.

Learning an instrument is not easy, it takes time and dedication, but the rewards last a lifetime!

Instrumental Lessons at MCE are as follows, all lessons take place during the school day:

- Sunday: Violin
- Monday: Piano and Voice
- Tuesday: Guitar
- Wednesday: Piano and Drums

We hope to soon be offering woodwind instruments, so please sign up for these as well.
